**Building Assessment vs Mortgage Commitments:** There seems to be some misunderstanding of the two. The building assessment is the \$300 that every member in the RGC <u>must pay</u>. The full amount can be paid in one payment, and that person will be given a plaque on the building pledge board, or the member can pay a minimum of \$100 per year. The building assessment is a must for new members. The building pledge boards are on the back middle wall of the foyer.

The mortgage commitment is a charitable donation made for the payment of the building note. A donation of \$300 or more gets you a plaque on the Mortgage Tree in the foyer on the south wall.

Although, the mortgage has been paid off, there is still building upkeep. So, those of you that did not make the initial \$300 donation still should consider sending a donation to Pat Jones. There are a lot of members who have not contributed to the cause; you really should fulfilled this voluntary financial obligation to the Royal Grand Chapter. It is an investment you should be proud to make.

**Veteran List:** Worthy Matrons send to me the names of all the sisters in your chapter that are veterans, and give the branch of the service and their retirement rank. Also, note if they are still active.
